# From Today's Bible Readings

**Luke 4:25-30** While He was preaching in a synagogue in Nazareth, Jesus compares Himself to two prophets, Elijah and Elisha, citing stories of how their prophecies and miracles were more welcome to outsiders than their "own." After these comments, the crowd furiously ejects Him from their midst. Reflection: Have you ever had the experience of being critical to friends and family out of love and concern, yet your words are unwelcome? Why is it so difficult to disagree about important things with those you grew up with or are close to?

**James 5:16-20** James talks about the power of righteous prayer. He cites Elijah as an example; the prophet prayed unceasingly for rain during a long

drought and finally his prayers were answered. Reflection: What do you think the apostle means by "righteous" prayer? (The prayer of a good person, someone who has centered his or her life in God, a prayer spoken genuinely from a caring heart.) When do you pray and what do you pray for?

I Kings 18:29-46; 2 Kings 2:1-15 It is a time of dreadful famine. After the pagan god Baal's priests prove unable to call upon his power, Elijah builds an altar and has the Israelites perform a ceremony of pouring water. Through God's power, the altar is consumed with fire and rain clouds appear on the horizon, bearing heavy, healing rains. In 2 Kings, Elijah is taken up to heaven in a whirlwind of flaming chariot and horses, as his successor, the prophet Elisha, watches.

## Remembrance of the Prophet Elijah

Elijah, a 9th century prophet whose life and works are recorded in I and 2 Kings, is one of the major prophets of the Old Testament. He is particularly known for his zealous struggle against idolatry spread in Israel by the apostate King Ahab and his wife Queen Jezebel. Elijah appeared along with Moses at the Transfiguration as the prophet of life and the new covenant; Moses represented the old covenant. Most importantly, Elijah did not experience death, but was taken to heaven like Mary, the Mother of God. He is mentioned in the hymn *Ee Verin*, sung during the Requiem Service. ("Receive us in Jerusalem above, in the dwellings of the angels, in Eden, the paradise where Enoch and Elijah live worthily resplendent in dove-like purity and in old age...") The Armenian Church (like all the Eastern churches) holds him in the highest esteem. His feast day is always on a Sunday because of his importance.

## PARTICIPATION IN THE DIVINE LITURGY

Please use the Divine Liturgy books that are found in the pew racks. These books contain the Armenian text as well as the English transliteration and translation in the second section.

For your convenience, the applicable page number in the burgundy Divine Liturgy book is located above both the right and left doors by the Altar leading to the Vestry and Baptistry. When the light shows green, the congregation stands; when the light shows red, the congregation kneels; and when green and red lights are off, you may be seated. If assistance is needed, please ask a member of the Parish Council.

Parishioners are also encouraged to sing with the Choir, whose real purpose is to lead the congregation in singing the hymns. Also join in the recitation of the Creed which is found on pages 18 and 19 of the second section.

## **VOGHCHOOYN - KISS OF PEACE**

During the Divine Liturgy, when the Parish Council members pass the Kiss of Peace in church, the response from the receiver should be "Orhnyal eh haidnootyunn Krisdosee" (Blessed is the revelation of Christ). When you give the Voghchooyn, please say "Krisdos e mech mer haydnetsav" (Christ is revealed amongst us).

## **CONFESSION AND HOLY COMMUNION**

Those faithful who feel spiritually prepared to receive our Lord in the sacrament of Holy Communion are asked to bring their pew books with them to the General Confession and, together with the deacon, are asked to read the confession aloud. The essence to this sacrament lies with the individual(s) offering his or her own confession through the priest to God. In addition to reading the text of the confession, each participant must recall his or her own sins, truly seek God's forgiveness, and make a commitment to the Lord to strive not to sin anymore. The English confession may be found on page 48 in the burgundy Divine Liturgy book and on page x in the blue Divine Liturgy book found in the pew racks. We urge our parishioners to come forward for confession and Holy Communion through the center aisle.
