Readings of the Day:

Is. 63:18- 64:12. Ti. 1:1-11. Jn. 7:37-52. Today's Bible reading is from the Gospel of Jesus Christ according to St. John, chapter 7, vs. 37-52 and will be read by Sona Tashjian.

From Today's Bible Reading

John 7:37-52 During the important Jewish Feast of the Tabernacles, Jesus has been teaching the crowds and the Temple authorities. He speaks of the "living water" that will flow from those who believe in him (meaning that they will be filled with the Holy Spirit). People ask one another if he is indeed the Christ. The Temple guards, transfixed by his words, feel powerless to intervene. *Reflection: Why were the guards unable to stop Jesus from speaking* (vv 45-46)? In what ways would the presence of the Holy Spirit in your life be like "flowing water?"

Titus 1:1-11 St. Paul advises his protégé Titus to discourage wrong teachings and to carefully consider the qualities of those appointed elders of the community. *Reflection: What are the qualities St. Paul considered important to those who lead a Christian community?* (vv 6-9) Why do you think these are mostly about 'being' rather than 'doing'? What would you add to the list?

Is 63:18-64:12 Israel continues its frank admission of sinfulness and pleads for God's merciful intervention. *Reflection: Meditate on 64:8; pray the verse several times slowly. Imagine yourself as soft clay on a potter's wheel with God's hands poised to shape you. What do you feel? Do you trust him to shape you?*

February 9 & 11: St. Ghevont and St. Vartan

Vartanantz commemorates St. Vartan and the other martyrs who perished in the Battle of Avarayr in 451 A.D. This was the war the Persians waged against the Armenians after attempting in vain to oppress them under Persian rule and religion. The Armenians were hugely outnumbered (60,000 Armenians against 200,000 Persians excluding the armored elephant brigade) in this first recorded battle in defense of Christianity. Under the leadership of their commander-in-chief, Vartan Mamigonian, they fought valiantly. Although the battle was lost, it paved the way for the religious freedom that was conferred not long afterwards through the efforts of Vartan's nephew, Vahan.

Fr. Ghevont was General Vartan's advisor, serving as what might be called today the army chaplain. Before the battle, he inspired the army with a deeply moving speech and went among the soldiers and encouraged them, holding the cross of Christ in his hand and distributing Holy Communion. St. Ghevont was later taken to Persia with other clergymen and in response to his fervent evangelizing, martyred along with the other priests. He and those clergy martyred with him are celebrated two days before Vartanantz, on the feast day known as Ghevontyantz.

GREAT LENT

Great Lent which begins Monday, February 15, and ends on Friday, March 26, is the 40-day period of spiritual preparation that leads to the greatest feast of the Church - Easter. It is a time for focused spiritual disciplines, prayer, reading the Bible, service, giving, fasting and living a simpler life.

Throughout Lent

- We do not receive or pass the Voghchooyn (Kiss of Peace).
- Holy Communion is not administered. Those in need of Holy Communion may see the Celebrant following the Badarak.
 - Mahs is distributed to the faithful regularly.
 - We do not approach the Celebrant at the conclusion of the Divine Liturgy to kiss the Gospel.

Governor Baker has announced an additional change beginning December 26, 2020. This change further reduces capacity for indoor worship. Holy Trinity Church will be adhering to an RSVP system in order for faithful to attend Church services safely.

Beginning at 12:01 a.m. on December 26, 2020, Massachusetts will implement temporary capacity limits to stop the spread of COVID-19 as cases and hospitalizations rise.

These limits continue to be in effect.

The Governor's revised social distancing guidelines, calling for a maximum 25% capacity in houses of worship, more significantly reduces the seating capacity in our sanctuary.

In order to comply and to ensure that we are able to maintain a safe number of attendees, attendance will be by reservation only.



General Guidelines

Arrival at Church

During Divine Liturgy

Livestreams will continue every Sunday beginning at 10:00 AM. We encourage parishioners to utilize this option, especially during the summer when wearing a mask in Church may be uncomfortable.

Please do not congregate before or after Church services. Upon arrival, please proceed to be seated and on departure please proceed directly to your car. Bathroom facilities and the Sanctuary will be sanitized on a regular basis following mandated guidelines and regulations.

We ask for your patience and cooperation during this time, especially as we adapt to new procedures and guidelines.

Please wear a facemask at all times upon arrival and throughout the service.

Please use hand sanitizer prior to entering the Sanctuary.

Seating in the Sanctuary will be limited in order to adhere to social distancing directives from local, state and diocesan sources. Please be flexible as you are ushered to your seat; you may not be able sit in your usual pew.

Please enter only through the main doors. If you are in need of special assistance, the door at Dorian Way will be available for those with special needs.

Please follow Parish Council guidance for seating and wait to be ushered in and seated

You may place your offering in baskets upon arrival or exit. New offering baskets with long poles will be utilized during services.

Pew books and Bibles have been removed from the Sanctuary.

The Kiss of Peace will be conducted by bowing the head toward others, without approaching or touching one another.

Holy Communion will not be administered for the time being, Packets of mahs will be distributed as parishioners enter the Sanctuary. Mahs will be packaged and distributed by gloved hands.

Please follow Parish Council guidance for departure and wait to be ushered out of the Sanctuary after Badarak.

Please stay home if you are feeling ill or are part of our vulnerable population
