Readings of the Day:

Is. 58:13-59:7. 1 Tm. 4:12-5:10. Jn: 3:13-21.

Today's Bible reading is from the Gospel of Jesus Christ according to St. John, chapter 3, vs. 13-21 and will be read by Sona Tashjian.

From Today's Bible Reading

John 3:13-21 Jesus is teaching the Pharisee Nicodemus: God's love for the world is so great that He has gifted it with His own Son, "not to condemn but to save" (v.17). Condemnation only occurs when we choose darkness over light (about which we first heard in John's prologue). Sadly, even though light has come into the world, people still fear its power to show them who they really are. Reflection: How open are you to the light that God might shed on your life?

1 Timothy 4:12-5:10 Placed in charge of the church founded in Ephesus, Timothy is encouraged to be confident in his gifts, even though he is a young man. St. Paul exhorts him to be an example in all he does and says and to treat others with love and respect, always helping those in need. Many verses are devoted to the care of widows, as these women were extremely vulnerable in a time when men were the legal and societal protectors of their families. Reflection: We've all heard the expression "he talks the talk but doesn't walk the walk." Why is personal example so important in Christian leadership (v.12)?

Isaiah 58:13-59:7 Following in a long tradition of prophetic writing, Isaiah challenges people to honor God's holy day with joy and hearts of faith. Both these chapters suggest that social justice is essential to holiness and honoring God; pious practices are meaningless if offered up by a sinful, unjust society. *Reflection: Think of how you honor the Sabbath and the promise of great joy when you put God front and center. Is there a way you can change Sundays for you and your family that might be more God-pleasing and lead to deeper happiness for you all?*




Fellowship Hour
