Readings of the Day:

Is. 63:18-64:12. Ti. 1:1-11. Jn. 7:37-52.

Today's Bible reading is from the Gospel of Jesus Christ according to St. John, chapter 7, vs. 37-52 and will be read by Sona Tashjian.

From Today's Bible Reading

John 7: 37-52 During the important Jewish Feast of the Tabernacles, Jesus has been teaching the crowds and the Temple authorities. He speaks of the "living water" that will flow from those who believe in Him (meaning that they will be filled someday with the Holy Spirit). People asked one another if He was indeed the Christ. The temple guards were too awed by His words to intervene. Reflection: Why might Nicodemus have defended Jesus? Read about his earlier encounter with Him in John 3:1-21. In what ways would the presence of the Holy Spirit in your life be like "flowing water?"

Titus 1:1-11 St. Paul advises his protégé Titus to discourage wrong teachings and to carefully consider the qualities of those appointed elders of the community. *Reflection: What are the qualities St. Paul considered important to those who lead a Christian community? (vv. 6-9; note St. Paul refers to leaders as husbands and fathers since church elders then were usually married.) Why do you think Paul's list of leadership qualifications focused mostly on "being" and not on "doing?"*

Is 63:18-64:12 Israel continues its frank admission of sinfulness and pleads for God's merciful intervention as their Father. *Reflection: In vv. 5-7, Isaiah describes God as one who always supports those who "gladly do right and remember His ways" but who will seem hidden from those who "never call on His name or strive to seek Him." Between these two poles, where is God in your life? If you are clay and God is the potter (v. 8), how does He shape you?*

February 14 & 16: St. Ghevont and St. Vartan

The Feast of St. Vartan and the 1,036 Martyrs (Vartanantz) commemorates the Battle of Avarayr in 451 A.D. This was the war the Persians waged against the Armenians after attempting in vain to oppress them under Persian rule and religion. The Armenians were hugely outnumbered in this first recorded battle in defense of Christianity. Under the leadership of their commander-in-chief, Vartan Mamigonian, they fought valiantly. Although the battle was lost, it paved the way for religious freedom three decades later, when the Treaty of Nuvarsak was brokered by Vartan's nephew, Vahan Mamigonian, in 484.

Fr. Ghevont was General Mamigonian's advisor, serving as what might be called today the army chaplain. Before the battle, he inspired the army with a deeply moving speech and went among the soldiers, distributing Holy Communion. St. Ghevont was later taken to Persia with other clergymen and in response to his fervent evangelizing, martyred along with the other priests. His memory is celebrated two days before Vartanantz, on the feast day of Ghevontyantz.

GREAT LENT

Great Lent which begins Monday, February 20, and ends on Saturday, April 1, is the 40-day period of spiritual preparation that leads to the greatest feast of the Church - Easter. It is a time for focused spiritual disciplines, prayer, reading the Bible, service, giving, fasting and living a simpler life.

Throughout Lent:

- We do not receive or pass the Voghchooyn (Kiss of Peace).
- Holy Communion is not administered. Those in need of Holy Communion may see the Celebrant following the Badarak.
 - Mahs is distributed to the faithful regularly.
 - We do not approach the Celebrant at the conclusion of the Divine Liturgy to kiss the Gospel.

Since 2001, the Holy Trinity ACYOA Juniors have raised and donated over \$7,000 to Rosie's Place





At the end of Church services, the ACYOA Juniors will be collecting donations in soup pots located in the front vestibule, baptistery and at Fellowship Hour







DEMONSTRATION TO END THE REPUBLIC OF ARTSAKH BLOCKADE





THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 16TH, 2023 11am-1pm





For over two months, the 120,000 Armenians of the Republic of Artsakh (also known as Nagorno Karabakh), including 30,000 children, have been under blockade. They are running out of medicines, food and other necessities, while gas, electricity and Internet access are periodically disrupted.

The government of Azerbaijan is attempting in this way to ethnically cleanse the native Armenian population of Artsakh and annex its territories, and Russian peacekeepers have been unable to intervene effectively.

The United States and various European governments have condemned the blockade. The Armenian-American community of greater Boston asks that you contact your government representatives to get the US to go one step further.

Ask them to apply direct pressure on Azerbaijan to end the blockade and organize an international airlift of supplies and aid to Artsakh, akin to that of Berlin in 1948-49.

Finally, ask them to sanction Aliyev and send a strong message that the USA will not tolerate dictators trampling on basic human rights.
