Readings of the Day: Is. 25:9-26:7. Phil. 1:1-11. Lk. 9:44-50.

Today's Bible reading is from the Gospel of Jesus Christ according to St. Luke, chapter 9, vs. 44-50 and will be read by Ann Danielson.

From Today's Bible Reading

Luke 9:44-50 Although they have just heard their beloved Master predict His betrayal, the disciples blithely begin to argue about who among them will be the greatest. Jesus derails their misguided debate by bringing a child to His side and challenging them to understand that the helpless and "least" in the world's eyes must gain their attention first. The theme of welcoming extends to the strange exorcist for whom He also asks a generosity of heart. *Reflection: In what ways do you reach out to the "least"?*

Philippians 1:1-11 St. Paul joyfully remembers the Philippians as deeply faithful and thinks of them as his fellow travelers, sharing in God's grace. He affirms that because of their faith and

missionary zeal ("your partnership in the gospel from the first"), God will continue to work in their lives and will bring their mission to "completion" at the end of time.

Reflection: This is the most joyful of St. Paul's letters, as he cheerleads his beloved church in Philippi. Who is your spiritual cheerleader right now?

Isaiah 25: 9-26:7 These verses begin with an oracle against Moab, a neighbor of Judea, and end in Chapter 26 with a beautiful psalm-like prayer of trust in God. *Reflection: In v. 26:4, we are advised to "trust in the Lord forever." What awaits us if we do?*

Saturday, November 18: Holy Apostles Andrew and Philip

We read in the gospels of Matthew (4:18-20) and Mark (1:16-18) that while walking beside the Sea of Galilee, Jesus noticed two fishermen, Andrew and his brother, Simon Peter, casting their nets. He famously called them to "Follow Me and I will make you fishers of men." This universal paradigm of discipleship and witness suggests that when we follow our Lord, we are changed by Him, and to such a degree that we want to share this with others that they too might follow and be transformed. Tradition reports that after preaching in Greece, Anatolia and elsewhere, Andrew was arrested and crucified on an x-shaped cross, feeling himself unworthy to be crucified as Jesus was. Like Andrew, Philip was from Bethsaida. After he was called by Jesus, he tells Bartholomew (John 1:45) -- who doubts anything "good can come from Nazareth" -- to "come and see." An account of his martyrdom relates that Philip was arrested with Bartholomew but brought about the latter's release even though he himself was crucified. Outside of the Gospels, incidents from the lives of these two apostles can be found in histories, hagiographies, and anonymous Acts.




